SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available after any Mass for the sick, the elderly and those going into the hospital and who are able to come to church. Just see the priest after Mass. For those who are homebound, please call the Rectory Office to arrange for a home visit by a priest. For emergency sick calls, please call 718 - 236 - 9166 any time during the person's sickness, the sooner, the better.

BAPTISMS

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated every first Sunday of the month after the 12:00pm mass. Private Baptism are available for Saturdays. Please come to the Parish Office with the child's birth certificate in order to make the arrangements.

CELEBRATION OF MARRIAGE

Marriage requires spiritual preparation. Please call the Rectory Office to arrange for an appointment with a priest at least six (6) months prior to the date of your wedding. Arrangements with the Church should be made before setting the date with the caterer. All couples who are getting married must participate in an approved diocesan or parish Pre-Cana Program before marrying.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

The RCIA process provides an opportunity for adults to explore the Roman Catholic faith. We welcome all non-Catholics who are interested in becoming Catholic, as well as those Catholics who have not received the Sacraments of Eucharist (First Communion) or Confirmation. Please contact the Office of Faith Formation.

We welcome you and invite you to join us by completing a registration form (available both at the Rectory Office and in the church) and returning it to the Rectory Office as soon as possible. If you are not registered, we may not be able to provide you with letters or certificates for Sacrament sponsorship, INS, schools, job references, etc.

Lenten Regulations 2022

ABSTINENCE: All the faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday (March 2, 2022) and on all the Fridays of the Lenten Season.

FASTING: All the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 (inclusive) are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday (April 15, 2022) by limiting oneself to one full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken at two other occasions during the day.

CHURCH DECORATIONS: Please do not leave flowers in the church during Lent.

LENTEN FOLDER: Please make sure to take home a Lenten folder for 40 Days of Sacrificial Offering through your daily personal sacrifices. Please return your envelope with offering of \$1.00 per day, in the Sunday basket or bring it to the parish office at the end of lent. Thank you.

REFLECTION ON THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Livery Second Sunday of Lent, the Lord offers us in his Transfiguration, a glimpse of the glory that is his with the Father. This glory will one day be ours too, when the Pascal Mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus is brought to fulfillment in us. Our Baptism into Jesus calls us to follow him faithfully, on the path of discipleship, through the Passion and Cross to Risen Glory. Our Lenten journey and the Eucharist help us to seek the Lord's face. We rejoice in his living presence among us and find strength for bearing more faithful witness to Jesus in the world. Our time in this holy season of prayer, fasting, abstinence and charity prepares us to renew our Baptismal (Covenant) Promises at Easter. In our reading from the Hebrew Scriptures, the Book of Genesis, we listen once again to God offering a covenant (last week to Noah and all creation) this week to Abraham. A covenant that calls us to obedience. The Lord says to Abraham: I will bless you abundantly and make your descendants as countless as the stars of the sky and the sands of the seashore; your descendants shall take possession of the gates of their enemies, and in your descendants all the nations of the earth shall find blessing—all this because you obeyed my command." St. Paul celebrates the perfect obedience of Jesus, whose radiant glory, glimpsed in the Transfiguration, will one day be ours. The Collect (Opening Prayer) of the Mass and the Gospel remind us that "we must listen to God's beloved Son and respond to Jesus' invitation to follow him in obedient faith and selfless love."
