

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available after any Mass for the sick, the elderly and those going into the hospital and who are able to come to church. Just see the priest after Mass. For those who are homebound, please call the Rectory Office to arrange for a home visit by a priest. For emergency sick calls, please call 718 - 236 - 9166 any time during the person's sickness, the sooner, the better.

BAPTISMS

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated every first Sunday of the month after the 12:00pm mass. Private Baptism are available for Saturdays. Please come to the Parish Office with the child's birth certificate in order to make the arrangements.

CELEBRATION OF MARRIAGE

Marriage requires spiritual preparation. Please call the Rectory Office to arrange for an appointment with a priest at least six (6) months prior to the date of your wedding. Arrangements with the Church should be made before setting the date with the caterer. All couples who are getting married must participate in an approved diocesan or parish Pre-Cana Program before marrying.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

The RCIA process provides an opportunity for adults to explore the Roman Catholic faith. We welcome all non-Catholics who are interested in becoming Catholic, as well as those Catholics who have not received the Sacraments of Eucharist (First Communion) or Confirmation. Please contact the Office of Faith Formation.

NEW PARISHIONERS / REGISTRATION

We welcome you and invite you to join us by completing a registration form (available both at the Rectory Office and in the church) and returning it to the Rectory Office as soon as possible. Combined with your regular use of envelopes for your weekly offering at Mass, it helps us to know that you are an active member of the Parish community. Please let us know that you are here so that we may serve you better. If you are not registered, we may not be able to provide you with letters or certificates for Sacrament sponsorship, INS, schools, job references, etc.

Please come to the Rectory Office to make arrangements for intentions for Masses. Memorials are also available on a weekly basis for the sanctuary candles, the altar candles and the bread and wine to be used during the week.

The Story of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary



On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a

broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity. There were few dissenting voices. What the pope solemnly declared was already a common belief in the Catholic Church.

We find homilies on the Assumption going back to the sixth century. In following centuries, the Eastern Churches held steadily to the doctrine, but some authors in the West were hesitant. However by the 13th century there was universal agreement. The feast was celebrated under various names—Commemoration, Dormition, Passing, Assumption—from at least the fifth or sixth century. Today it is celebrated as a solemnity.

Scripture does not give an account of Mary's assumption into heaven. Nevertheless, Revelation 12 speaks of a woman who is caught up in the battle between good and evil. Many see this woman as God's people. Since Mary best embodies the people of both Old and New Testaments, her assumption can be seen as an exemplification of the woman's victory.

Furthermore, in 1 Corinthians 15:20, Paul speaks of Christ's resurrection as the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.

Since Mary is closely associated with all the mysteries of Jesus' life, it is not surprising that the Holy Spirit has led the Church to believe in Mary's share in his glorification. So close was she to Jesus on earth, she must be with him body and soul in heaven.
