SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available after any Mass for the sick, the elderly and those going into the hospital and who are able to come to church. Just see the priest after Mass. For those who are homebound, please call the Rectory Office to arrange for a home visit by a priest. **For emergency sick calls, please call 718 - 236 - 9166 any time during the person's sickness, the sooner, the better.**

BAPTISMS

Group Baptisms will take place on the First Sunday of the month in English and the Last Sunday of the month in Spanish at 2PM. If you want a private baptism please contact the office for more information. All arrangements must be done one month in advance.

CELEBRATION OF MARRIAGE

Marriage requires spiritual preparation. Please call the Rectory Office to arrange for an appointment with a priest at least six (6) months prior to the date of your wedding. Arrangements with the Church should be made before setting the date with the caterer. All couples who are getting married must participate in an approved diocesan or parish Pre-Cana Program before marrying.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

The RCIA process provides an opportunity for adults to explore the Roman Catholic faith. We welcome all non-Catholics who are interested in becoming Catholic, as well as those Catholics who have not received the Sacraments of Eucharist (First Communion) or Confirmation. Please contact the Office of Faith Formation.

NEW PARISHIONERS / REGISTRATION

We welcome you and invite you to join us by completing a registration form (available both at the Rectory Office and in the church) and returning it to the Rectory Office as soon as possible. Combined with your regular use of envelopes for your weekly offering at Mass, it helps us to know that you are an active member of the Parish community. If you are not registered, we may not be able to provide you with letters or certificates for Sacrament sponsorship, INS, schools, job references, etc.

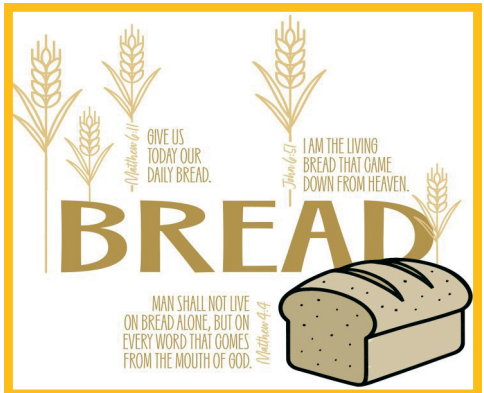

ALL ABOUT THE FEAST OF

Corpus Christi

What we celebrate

Corpus Christi is a feast day with the sole purpose of focusing on the Holy Eucharist.



When we celebrate

Officially the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. However, it's most often celebrated on the Sunday after Trinity Sunday.

Ways we celebrate

- A procession of the Eucharist around your parish.
- Eucharistic Adoration after Mass.
- Praying a traditional Catholic prayer called "Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament" at the end of Mass and singing songs about the Eucharist.
- If the Feast of Corpus Christi is a public holiday where you live, you may see a Eucharist procession (sometimes by candlelight) happening in the streets.

History

Saint Juliana of Liege (1193-1258), who had a great reverence for the Blessed Sacrament, began the cause for the feast day of Corpus Christi. This day would be apart from Holy Thursday when the Church focuses on not only the Eucharist but the washing of the feet, ordained priesthood, and Jesus in agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. Saint Juliana was motivated by a recurring vision of the Church as a full moon with one dark spot, which she interpreted as the absence of a specific reverence to the Holy Eucharist. In her later years, she gained the support of Jacques Pantaléon, at the time Archdeacon of Liège, and other Church leaders. Pantaléon was later elected Pope Urban IV and went on to establish the Feast of Corpus Christi.

Homework

Spend some time in prayer today asking for a greater ability to see the face of Christ in others. (If you're Catholic, spend that prayer time in front of the Blessed Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist). Then say a quick prayer for five random people that you pass throughout your day.

PARTS OF A MONSTRANCE

(monstrance gets its name from the Latin word: "monstrare," meaning "to show.")

SUNBURST/RAYS: a decorative frame often made of gold or silver and in the shape of a pattern radiating from the center, symbolizing Christ, "the light of the world."

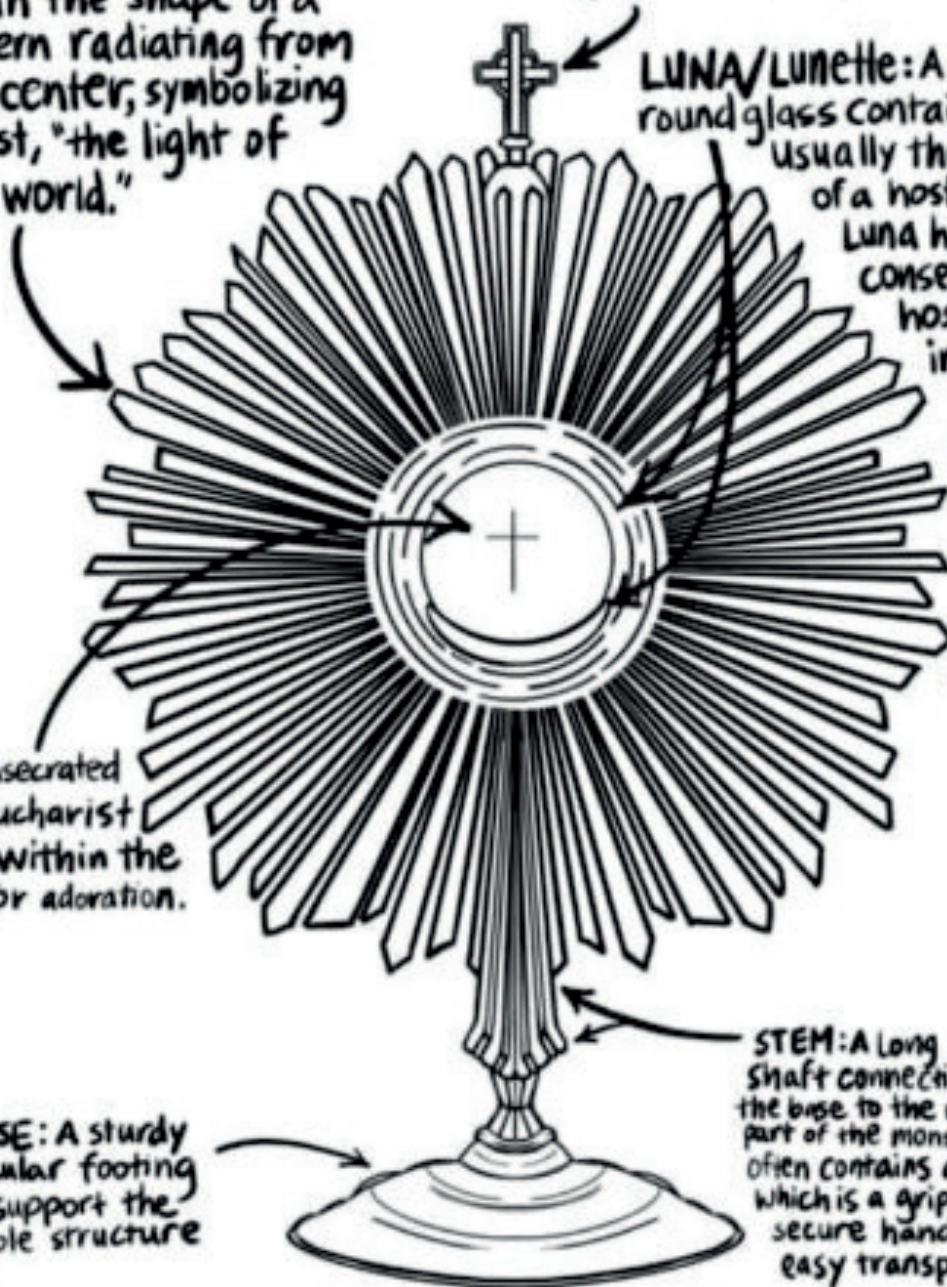
CROSS: Represents Christ and the crucifixion. Often at the very top.

LUNA/LUNETTE: A small, round glass container, usually the size of a host. The Luna holds the consecrated host securely in place. The clear glass allows the host to be visible for adoration, yet protected.

The consecrated Host/Eucharist placed within the Luna for adoration.

BASE: A sturdy circular footing to support the whole structure

STEM: A long shaft connecting the base to the upper part of the monstrance. often contains a knob, which is a grip for secure handling and easy transport.

Baptism

Baptism is the sacrament of new life, through which a person is welcomed into the Church, freed from sin, and becomes a child of God. It marks the start of a lifelong relationship with Christ and the Catholic community.

First Holy Communion

The First Holy Communion or receiving the Eucharist for the first time, is a deepening of that relationship. Catholics believe the Eucharist is truly the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Through it, the faithful are spiritually nourished, united more closely with Jesus, and strengthened to live out their faith in daily life.

Confirmation

Confirmation completes the grace of Baptism. In this sacrament, the individual is sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, receiving strength, courage, and guidance to live as a committed disciple of Christ. It empowers them to take a more active role in the Church and to witness their faith with maturity.

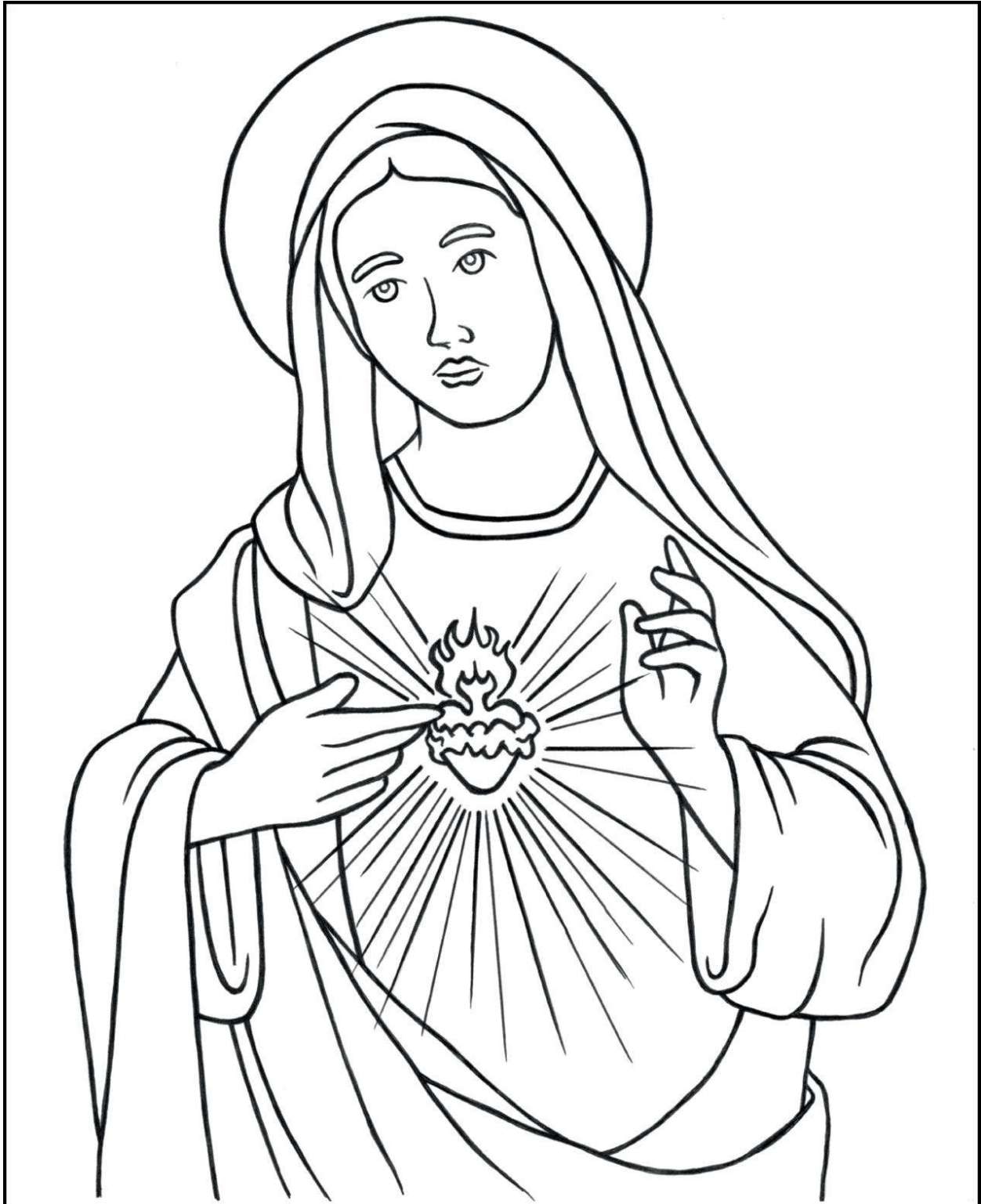
Confirmación
